Chapter 4 reviews academic language and literacy instruction while the next addresses the components of instruction in Spanish. Chapter 9 reviews English language development and provides lesson plans for implementing SDAIE programs. Finally, Chapter 10 discusses two-way bilingual immersion and shares actual classroom schedules and lessons.
